Spring is here! With it brings lots of activity within the city. Parks are open, fishing pond has been stocked, town cleanup has been planned and water has been turned on. The City intends to adopt an ordinance creating water restrictions such as no watering between 10:00 am and 6:00 pm, no watering of the same area in excess of 1 hour per day or otherwise wasting water. The council will consider granting exceptions for agriculture, business, churches and parks. If you feel you need an exception, please contact the city office to apply. There will be NO TOLERANCE for water misuse and fines will be imposed. We also ask that you DO NOT place yard waste, such as grass clippings, weeds or trash in the canal. The debris plugs valve openings and causes problem in the irrigating systems. We appreciate everyone's efforts in making our water supply flow as effectively and last as long as possible.

The (ity has received numerous complaints about animals at large and the messes they make on others property. Please be mindful of your animal's and keep them on leashes. Be the neighbor you'd like to have!
