Presentation of Utility Financial Solutions Energy Rate Study - Jillian Jurczyk 32 33 The Council met electronically with representatives from Utility Financial Solutions (UFS) 34 Jillian Jurczyk and Chris Land to review Monroe's electric cost of service study, financial 35 projections and rate design. 36 37 Ms. Jurczyk explained that the main objective of the study was: 38 Financial Projections 39 Monroe City Council Special Meeting

 Debt Coverage Ratio 40 Cash Policy 41 Optimal Operating Income 42 Review cost of Service Results 43 Class Cost Results 44 Customer Charges 45 Overview of Rates and Power Cost Adjustments 46 47 It was explained that the power department needs to recover the cost for a connection to 48 the grid at zero kWh consumption. This is what the base rate should cover, and the kWh 49 charge should cover the cost of purchasing and generating power. 50 51 After reviewing our current rates, it was apparent that some of our customer rates are a 52 little higher than they should be, and some are lower than they should be. The 53 governmental rate needs to be changed to small business with demand rate, and our 54 agricultural customers need to have an increase in the monthly base rate because they 55 are only paying the base rate for six-months of the year. 56 57 Ms. Jurczyk stated that because Monroe City already has an auto-adjustment rate 58 effective each July 1, the rate restructuring rates recommended will basically be equal to 59 the rate increase our customers would see with our current auto-adjustment rate. 60 61 Ms. Jurczyk is recommending we increase our base rate about 2.5% and replace the tiered 62 rate structure with a flat rate. This is a more efficient way of charging for power 63 consumption to our customers and office staff. 64 65 Ms. Jurczyk reviewed with the Council what the new rates would be to all customer 66 classes and explained that with the changes the power department would still see the 67 same amount of revenue. 68 69 It was discussed the importance of the power department maintaining a certain amount 70 of cash on hand. This cash on hand would cover power supply, hydro production risk, and 71 an emergency fund. Because we implemented the auto-adjustment rate some time ago it 72 was determined by the study that our power department current cash on hand meets the 73 74 recommended minimum cash balance amount for 2025. 75 It was discussed that with the rates proposed from the study, the revenue will cover the 76 power department's expenses including depreciation. 77 78 It was explained a purchase power adjustment policy is a tool to be used to cover 79 fluctuations in the power we purchase. This money is not used for anything but to cover 80

to cover the increased cost of our purchased power.

The Council discussed that the information shared with them today from Ms. Jurczyk and 84 Mr. Land has been very helpful and they believe it was money well spent. Mr. Land 85 explained that it is important to have these studies done periodically to keep the 86 departments going in the right direction. The Council agreed and thanked them for their 87 time. 88 89 Ms. Jurczyk, Mr. Land, and Councilmember Mathie left the meeting. 90 91 b. Discuss and consider energy rate study recommendations 92 93 Council reviewed the information and suggested rate structures presented tonight by 94 representatives of UFS. It was determined that they would like to hold a public hearing at 95 our next meeting and propose the updated rate schedule. 96 97 Councilmember Payne made a motion to hold a public hearing on July 9, 2024, to 98 receive comments on the proposed rate schedule. Councilmember Cartwright seconded 99 the motion. A roll call vote was called. Voting yes: Councilmembers Cartwright, 100 Johnson, and Payne. The vote was unanimous. Motion carried 3-0 101 102 4.
